

As We Gather

Jacob wrestled with God; Paul urged Timothy to "be sober-minded, endure suffering, do the work of an evangelist, fulfill your ministry" (2 Timothy 4:5), and Jesus speaks of the widow who kept on petitioning the unjust judge for justice. These examples from the Scriptures all point to one thing: persistence—keeping-on-keeping-on even in the face of obstacles, difficulties, and suffering. However, Jesus reminds us of two important truths: heroism and willpower accomplish nothing of value under the reign of God, and the God we persist in petitioning is no unjust and uncaring judge, but rather our gracious, loving Father who always delights to hear and answer the prayers of His people!

Holy Communion

Holy Communion is being celebrated today. It is the belief of the Lutheran Church, based on Jesus' own words, that in this Sacrament His body and blood are really present and that forgiveness of sins and the assurance of salvation are offered to all who come confessing their sins and believing in Him. Communion is therefore offered to those who share this confession of faith. Children who are not yet confirmed are invited to come forward with their parents to receive a blessing. THE OLD TESTAMENT READING: Genesis 32:22–30 (*"I will not let You go unless You bless me."*)

²² The same night he arose and took his two wives, his two female servants, and his eleven children, and crossed the ford of the Jabbok. ²³ He took them and sent them across the stream, and everything else that he had. ²⁴ And Jacob was left alone. And a man wrestled with him until the breaking of the day. ²⁵ When the man saw that he did not prevail against Jacob, he touched his hip socket, and Jacob's hip was put out of joint as he wrestled with him. ²⁶ Then he said, "Let me go, for the day has broken." But Jacob said, "I will not let you go unless you bless me." ²⁷ And he said to him, "What is your name?" 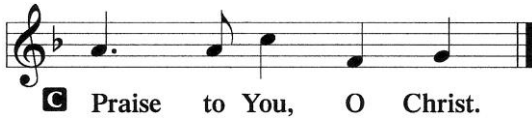


